CRITERIA TO BE FULFILLED:

Criterion	Points
1. Organize a Club Service project	[10]
2. Organize an International Service project	[10]
3. Organize a Professional Development project	[10]
4. Organize a Community Service project	[10]
5. Organize a Rotaract- Rotaract joint project with other Rotaract Clubs	[15]
6. Organize a Rotary-Rotaract joint project with any Rotary Club	[15]
7. Organize a Rotary-Rotaract-Interact joint project	[15]
8. Send participant(s) to district events (3 points per event, max 15 points)*	[15]
9. Host a district event on behalf of Rotaract District 3300*	[15]

***District events include:**

1. District Rotaract Assembly (DRA) 2017 – Spectrum (25th-26th March 2017)
2. District Rotaract Conference (DRC) 2018 – Ice & Fire (4th-7th Jan 2018)
3. District Awards Night (DAN) 2018
4. Goodwill Visit to Taiwan 2018 (4th – 8th April 2018)
5. District Sports Carnival (the carnival consists of 4 sessions; each session is considered as 1 district event)

There may be more District Events to come that are not included in this list at the time this document is released.

To be eligible for the DRR Citation, a club must achieve a minimum of 75 points in total, based on the point allocation given in the list of criteria above.
